AMENDED AND RESTATED BY-LAWS

OF

PUBLIC WELFARE FOUNDATION, INC. (Revised September 13, 2013)

ARTICLE I

General Provisions, Names, Principal Office, Object and Seal.

- Section 1. The name of this corporation is PUBLIC WELFARE FOUNDATION, INC.
- Section 2. The registered office of this corporation shall be located in the City of Wilmington, New Castle County Delaware. The corporation may have offices at such other places within or without the state of Delaware as the Board of Directors may from time to time establish.
- Section 3. The purpose for which the corporation is formed is the support of any benevolent, charitable, educational or missionary undertaking, including support and education of minor children and other persons, the general assistance of needy persons, and the support of such other worthy enterprises as the Directors may from time to time select, with the right to receive contributions and to acquire property for such purposes.

Its activities may be carried on in any state or territory of the United States or in any country of the world, it being the purpose of the corporation to expend its funds in such manner and in such plans as to be of maximum benefit to the recipients and to society.

Section 4. The Secretary-Treasurer shall have custody of the corporate seal of the corporation and shall have authority to affix the same to any instrument requiring it and when so affixed, it may be attested by his/her signature. The Board of Directors may give general authority to any other officer to affix the seal of the corporation and to attest the affixing by his/her signature.

ARTICLE II

Members

Section 1. The Directors of the corporation are its members.

Section 2. The members have no voting rights other than those required by law to be exercised by members of the corporation.

Section 3. If any action is required by law to be taken by the members of the corporation, such action may be taken by Directors of the corporation without any further formalities.

ARTICLE III

Directors

Section 1. The Board of Directors of the corporation shall consist of not less than three nor more than thirteen persons, all of whom shall be adults interested in the charitable purposes for which the corporation was chartered. The number of Directors within such minimum and maximum shall be fixed by resolution of the directors.

Directors shall be elected for three-year terms, which terms shall be staggered. By random drawing, four Directors will be elected for three-year terms beginning in 1992 and another four beginning in 1993. The remaining three Directors will be elected for three-year terms beginning in 1994. The three classes of Directors shall be kept as nearly equal in number as possible. A Director may be removed by vote of at least two-thirds of the other Directors then serving.

The President shall be an ex-officio, non-voting member of the Board of Directors and shall not be counted for purposes (i) of the fixed number of Directors, (ii) of determining a quorum at a meeting of the Board, or (iii) of calculating the number of Directors required for a vote.

Section 2. No new Director joining the Board of Directors after July 31, 2007, may be elected to more than three consecutive three-year terms in office. For purposes of this rule, a Director's terms in office shall be considered consecutive unless they are separated by a year or more, and any terms of less than three years shall be aggregated and rounded to the nearest whole number of three-year terms. (For example, a single nine-month term would be disregarded, but a nine-month term and a one-year term together would be considered a single three-year term.)

By random drawing, each of the ten Board members in office on July 31, 2007 (excluding the President) ("2007 Directors")

shall be assigned one of three mandatory retirement months: four 2007 Directors shall be required to retire from the Board by January 2012, three by January 2013, and three by January 2014. The retirement of any 2007 Director does not shorten that Director's term, and the vacancy caused by such retirement must be filled for the remaining portion of that term, as provided in Article IV, Section 6 of these By-Laws.

Any person who has been on the Board for the maximum time allowed may nonetheless be elected again to the Board after being off the Board for a period of at least one year.

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall have the right to hold meetings outside the State of Delaware.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall have complete management and control of all business of the corporation. They shall have the power to accept gifts and contributions on behalf of the corporation and to decide all matters of policy, including the charitable enterprises which the corporation shall operate or support and the manner thereof, and in general the persons, firms, or corporations who shall receive grants from the corporation.

Section 5. The Board of Directors of the corporation shall have the right at any time by a majority vote to require any officer or employee of the corporation to enter into a fidelity bond in such form as may be deemed advisable by the Board of Directors, the premium for such bond to be paid for by the corporation out of its own funds.

Section 6. Vacancies occurring on the Board of Directors shall be filled by majority vote of the Directors as soon as feasible after the vacancy occurs. A new Director shall be elected to fill the same term as the Director he/she is replacing. The Secretary shall, upon receiving notice of a vacancy in the Board, give written notice of such vacancy to the remaining Directors.

Section 7. The Board of Directors at each annual meeting by majority vote shall elect from among its members a Chair who shall serve until the next annual meeting and until a successor shall have been elected and qualified. Such Chair shall not be a staff member of the corporation. The Chair shall preside over meetings of Directors, approve and set agendas of such meetings, serve as an ex-officio member of all committees, and appoint members of all committees, subject to approval of Directors.

ARTICLE IV

Meetings of the Directors

Section 1. The Directors shall hold an annual meeting at the time designated by the Secretary in a written notice of at least ten days in advance of such meeting to each then Director of the corporation specifying the time and place of such meeting. Annual meetings of Directors may be held outside the State of Delaware, and notice of such meeting may be waived in writing by any Director either before or after such meeting.

In accordance with the Certificate of Incorporation, a Director may cast his/her vote on any matter in person or by absentee vote in writing, addressed to the Secretary.

Section 2. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called at any time by the Chair, the Vice Chair, or any two members of the Board of Directors, acting with or without meeting, and may be held at such place within or without the State of Delaware and at such time as may be stated in the notice of the meeting. Unless otherwise provided by law, any Director either before or after any meeting of the Board of Directors, may waive in writing any notice required to be given by law or under these By-Laws and any meeting of the Board of Directors shall be legal meeting without any notice thereof having been given if at least two-thirds of the Directors shall be present thereat or shall, either before or after said meeting, waive notice thereof.

Notice of any special meeting shall be given at least ten days prior to the meeting and such notice need not state the purposes for which the meeting is called. At any meeting of the Board of Directors any business presented for consideration at the meeting may be considered and acted upon by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. A majority of the Directors in office shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business of the corporation, provided that whenever less than a quorum is present at the time and place appointed for any meeting of the Board, a majority of those present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without notice other than by announcement at such meeting until a quorum shall be present. The action of a majority of Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the action of the Board of Directors.

Section 4. Any or all of the foregoing requirements may be waived by the unanimous written consent of the Directors of the corporation.

- Section 5. Each Director shall disclose to the Board any real or perceived conflict of interest that he/she has on matters under consideration by the corporation, including without limitation special interests in or relationships to grant proposals or financial transactions. Disinterested Directors shall determine whether an actual conflict exists. If the disinterested Directors determine that a conflict does exist, then the conflicted Director may not vote or otherwise participate in discussions of matters in which he/she has a conflict of interest, except that he/she may answer questions posed by other Directors on such issues. The Board may approve a transaction that involves a conflict of interest only if the Board determines that the transaction is entirely fair to the corporation.
- Section 6. A Director shall serve until the end of his or her term, resignation, retirement or death, or until removed by vote of at least two-thirds of the Directors then serving. Such removal shall create a vacancy on the Board. A new Director shall be elected to complete the same term as the Director he/she is replacing.
- Section 7. Any vacancy in the Board of Directors caused by resignation, death or removal of a Director shall be filled by the vote of a majority of the remaining Directors.
- Section 8. Any action taken on behalf of the corporation by an officer thereof in excess of authority conferred upon him or her by these By-Laws or otherwise may be ratified in writing by two-thirds of the Directors and such written ratification shall constitute such act of the corporation to the same extent as though said act had been previously authorized.

ARTICLE V

Officers

- Section 1. The officers of the corporation shall be chosen by the Board of Directors and shall consist of a Chair, President, Secretary-Treasurer, and any Vice Chair or Assistant Vice Chairs or Assistant Vice Secretary-Treasurers as the Board of Directors may deem necessary and appropriate from time to time.
- Section 2. The officers of the corporation shall serve for a period of one year and until their successors are elected and have qualified, but no officer (other than the President) may

serve more than five consecutive one-year terms. Any officer may be removed at any time by vote of two-thirds of the Board of Directors, with or without cause. Any such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.

Section 3. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of the meetings of Directors, give all notices required by law or these By-Laws, and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors. He/she also shall receive and safely keep all money and securities of the corporation and present financial statements at any meeting of the Board of Directors when requested to do so by the President or by a majority of the Board of Directors. He/she shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by these By-Laws, the Board of Directors, or the President.

ARTICLE VI

President

- Section 1. The President shall be the chief executive of the corporation. Subject to the direction and supervision of the Board of Directors, he or she shall have entire and complete control and management of the affairs of the corporation.
- Section 2. In the event of the death, disability, or resignation of the President, the Board shall appoint an Acting Chief Executive Officer who shall have the powers and responsibilities of the President until a new President is named.

ARTICLE VII

Committees

- Section 1. The Board of Directors may, by resolution of a majority of the whole Board, from time to time designate such committees as in their opinion are necessary and appropriate to conduct the affairs of the Foundation. The Chair of the Board shall propose the Chairs, members, and mandates of such committees for approval by the full Board of Directors. The Board may, from time to time, make such changes in the foregoing committee appointments and mandates as it shall deem appropriate.
 - Section 2. A committee, by affirmative vote of a

majority of its members present at any meeting, provided that a majority thereof is present, may adopt or amend its own rules for conducting its affairs, and determine the time, place and number of its meetings.

Section 3. By majority vote, the Directors of the Foundation may dissolve any committee, withdraw the appointment of members to any committee or the designation of its Chair, or modify the assignment of tasks to any committee or withdraw any jurisdiction previously given to such committee by the Board of Directors or the Chair of the Board.

ARTICLE VIII

Action Without Meeting

- Section 1. Any action which may be authorized or taken at a meeting of the Directors may be authorized or taken without a meeting in a writing or writings signed by all of the Directors who would be entitled to notice of a meeting for such purpose.
- Section 2. Any such writing shall be filed with or entered upon the records of the corporation.

ARTICLE IX

Indemnification and Insurance

The corporation shall, except as provided or Section 1. limited by Sections 3 and 4 of this Article IX, indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit, or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative, by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, limited liability company, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise (each, an "Outside Enterprise"), and shall advance expenses to such person reasonably incurred in connection therewith, to the fullest extent permitted by the relevant provisions of the General Corporation Law of the State of Delaware, as such law presently exists or may hereafter be amended. The corporation shall be required to indemnify a person in connection with a proceeding initiated by such person only if the proceeding was authorized by the Directors of the Foundation.

- Section 2. The corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the corporation, or who was or is serving at the request of the corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of an Outside Enterprise, against any liability asserted against him or her and incurred by him or her in any such capacity, or arising out of his or her status as such, whether or not the corporation would have the power to indemnify him or her against such liability under the provisions of this Article IX.
- Section 3. The corporation's obligation, if any, to indemnify any person who is or was serving at its request as a director, officer, employee, or agent of an Outside Enterprise must be reduced by any amount such person collects as indemnification from such Outside Enterprise.
- Section 4. In no event shall the corporation be required to indemnify any person pursuant to Section 1 of this Article IX for any penalties or fines that are imposed in connection with any criminal action, suit, or proceeding and that are not covered by any insurance policy maintained by the corporation pursuant to Section 2 of this Article IX.

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the Board hereby authorizes and directs the officers and staff of the Foundation to incorporate the preceding amendments to the By-Laws, as adopted by the Board, into the By-Laws as kept in the records of the Foundation and to restate all By-Laws of the Foundation currently in effect in one document.

General Authority

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the Board hereby authorizes and directs the officers of the Foundation to execute any other documents and take such further actions as may be necessary or advisable to carry out the purposes of the foregoing resolutions, including the inclusion of these resolutions in the records of the meetings of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X

Fiscal Year

Section 1. The fiscal year of this corporation shall commence on the first day of October and end on the thirtieth day of September of each year.

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the Board hereby authorizes and directs the officers and staff of the Foundation to incorporate the preceding amendments to the By-Laws, as adopted by the Board, into the By-Laws as kept in the records of the Foundation and to restate all By-Laws of the Foundation currently in effect in one document.

ARTICLE XI

Amendment of By-Laws

- Section 1. These By-Laws may be altered, changed or amended by the Board of Directors of the Corporation at any regular or special meeting upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors.
- Section 2. Proposals to amend these By-Laws shall be submitted, in writing, to the Secretary who shall provide each Director with a copy thereof at least 30 days prior to the meeting at which such proposed amendment is to be voted upon.
